We do this through shared learning and education, direct lifesaving, and continuous innovation.





WHAT WE DO

Muddy Paws Rescue is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization that partners with open-intake shelters across the U.S. to place homeless dogs into adoptable homes. Ultimately, we envision a world in which adopting a dog is a positive and stress-free experience for all, removing all barriers and encouraging adoption as the first option to be considered when adding a pet to a family.

Since the organization's founding in 2016, we have **saved nearly 7,000 lives**.

With a dedicated team of fosters, volunteers, and animal welfare advocates,

Muddy Paws Rescue strives to be New York City's leader in responsible, foster-based practices.





We have always valued our ability to change and evolve with the times, remain light on our feet, and make adjustments wherever needed so that we can best serve the pups and our two-legged community. As a result, we are constantly evaluating our impact and making improvements to our processes—and 2022 was no exception!

I am so proud of the way that our community has embraced such big changes over the last year. This included rolling out a brand new (and improved!) adoptions process and building and adapting best practices from scratch at our new headquarters. Change is never easy, but it will always be essential as we continue to establish ourselves as leaders in the foster-based animal rescue world.

Since I founded Muddy Paws Rescue over 7 years ago, one of the questions I have been asked most frequently is, "Are you going to keep growing?" This is not a simple question, and it doesn't have a simple answer. To me, growth can mean many things. It may include numbers and statistics, or it could simply mean the opposite of stagnation, and doing something new and varied every day.

In short, my answer is yes. Every change we make constitutes growth—rooted in the foundation of wanting to save as many lives as we responsibly can.

I'm very excited to share with you the growth that we experienced in 2022. Thank you for joining us on our journey this past year!



SUPPORTING AT-RISK POPULATIONS

As a New Hope partner for New York City Animal Care Centers, we provide support to NYC's homeless animal population—especially those that require specialized medical care or behavior training.

Through our transport program, we provide support to other parts of the country where shelters face a more significant overpopulation issue than the Northeast and a shortage of adopters given their rural locations. Because these partners must also prioritize rescue placement for their most vulnerable populations, we strive to intake as many at-risk dogs as we responsibly can to provide them with the specialized care and support they need while awaiting adoption.

GIVING OUR DOGS THE TOOLS THEY NEED TO SUCCEED

Our commitment to supporting the unique medical and behavioral needs of every dog who enters our care means knowing when professional intervention is needed. In 2022, we expanded our network of trusted training partners. We **utilize these partnerships to provide 1:1 behavioral support** to the dogs who need it—just as we would call the vet if they needed medical support.

Through our new partnership with Lead Your K9 in Orwigsburg, PA, we now have the option to enroll our dogs in a board & train program outside of the city if they require additional training or support. Board and Train programs offer a controlled environment where our pups can thrive and focus on learning the critical skills they need to be successful in their adoptive homes.







A VISIT TO OUR LONGEST STANDING SHELTER PARTNER

In September, our team took the trek down to Kentucky to visit with our biggest shelter partner, Bowling Green Warren County Humane Society (BGWCHS). We spent three days side-by-side with their hardworking staff, meeting future Muddy Paws pups, volunteering, and learning more about their operations.

BGWCHS takes in an average of 50-80 animals per day. Since their intake far outpaces the number of local families looking to adopt, BGWCHS has developed a robust transport program that sends more than one hundred animals to partners like us every two to three weeks.

Muddy Paws Rescue is proud to be one of their largest receiving partners. Thanks to our growing community of fosters, adopters, and donors, we are now able to welcome around 60 pups each month from Kentucky, which frees up space in their facility to save more lives each day.



A RECORD-BREAKING YEAR FOR LIFESAVING

Because we are a foster-based rescue with no physical shelter, we only have the capacity to save as many dogs as we have foster parents. That's why in 2022, we dug deep to figure out how to increase our foster onboarding completion rate and minimize the dropoffs we were seeing. We determined it was time to refresh our foster orientation video and quiz, and did a complete refresh to make it shorter and simpler, while still comprehensive enough to ensure the safety of our pups.

Our onboarding refresh meant that we were able to onboard more fosters and increase our lifesaving capacity in 2022.

Muddy Paws Rescue relies on the support and commitment of our volunteers to save thousands of lives each year. In 2022, almost 600 dog-loving, generous humans donated their time and unique skill sets to support every facet of our operations, including providing 1:1 support for our foster parents, keeping our mobile adoption events running smoothly, fundraising hundreds of thousands of dollars to support our pups, and of course—helping 1,024 families find their new best friend.

Volunteer Spotlight: Welcoming our first-ever Pack HQ Interns

In Summer 2022, Muddy Paws Rescue welcomed three interns to our Pack HQ for the first time as a **Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)** worksite. SYEP is a six-week paid internship program funded by the NYC Department of Youth and Community Development.

The program works with various youth service agencies to place New York City teenagers aged 16-19 years old in **opportunities that allow them to explore career paths based on their interests.** We're so grateful to have spent the summer with Angel (left), Molly (middle), and Kathy (right)!



A TRULY OPEN ADOPTIONS EXPERIENCE

Anyone who's met us knows that we are always looking for ways to improve. We've practiced open/conversational adoptions since 2017, but as the volume of applicants continued to grow, it became very apparent to us that we had unintentionally created some massive bottlenecks in the process.

In September 2022, we launched a new process designed to be more accessible and much, much faster for adopters. Instead of waiting weeks to snag an open phone call spot to meet with one of our adoption volunteers, our adopters now complete a quick Matchmaking questionnaire that allows us to learn exactly what they're looking for in a dog, in their own words, and on their own time. The entire process from start to finish now takes less than a week if done remotely, and less than an hour in person at our mobile adoption events.





And, because we are advocates for both the animals and for the humans looking to add a pet to their family, this change included a very important update to how we talk about adopting: **No more applications.** No more "applying" to adopt, or questions about what you need to get "approved." Our new adoption registration process puts the adopter squarely in the driver's seat. We're simply here to offer guidance and support as needed.

By removing these barriers and streamlining the entire process, we are now able to provide more direct support to adopters, shorten the average length of stay for our dogs, and ultimately increase our lifesaving capacity.



THE POWER OF PUBLIC RELATIONS

Media appearances raise awareness for our organization and mission, while also building relationships with far-reaching media channels and public figures. Through opportunities for earned media, Muddy Paws is able to **build long-lasting and sustainable credibility in the New York City area and beyond.** Shared learning, education, and continuous innovation are central to our mission, and these opportunities allow us to showcase best practices on a broader scale. In 2022, our efforts to leverage new media opportunities helped bring rescue to new audiences at both the local and national levels.




REVENUE & EXPENSES
