HAPPY TAILS: SPUD

Spud came to us from Kentucky back in September 2019, and his journey to finding his forever home would be longer than that of many human members of the Muddy Paws Pack.

When we first met Spud, he was an excited, adorable, lovable one-year-old pup, but he wasn't so sure about relocating to NYC. He loved to play, but was not a fan of walking on a leash, did not like to be left alone, and did not understand the concept of housetraining. After a few months and a few very dedicated foster homes, Spud mastered house and crate training, but was still wary of the big city.

We knew that with enough love and hard work, as well as the help of a dedicated trainer, Spud would become a more balanced and confident pup and the perfect sweet potato we all knew he could be.

After almost 280 days in foster care, Spud finally found his forever family. Olivia and Mark took one look at Spud and decided they wanted to be his parents, and after a short trial period, they quickly became one big happy family!

Since his adoption, Spud now enjoys going for hikes, playing in the dog park at least once a day (with proper manners, of course!), romping around in the water, and playing with his plushie toys. His family says, "He makes his own splashes in the water and tries to bite the droplets that fly into the air. He is a very happy dog, and he has really settled in."



HAPPY TAILS: ZION



Zion is an 8-year-old Boroughbred who came to us from NYC Animal Care Centers in the early days of the COVID-19 lockdown.

As soon as she entered our care, it became clear that Zion had several medical issues including breathing difficulties, allergies, a bladder infection, and severe anxiety. After many diagnostic tests and seemingly never-ending vet visits, it was determined that Zion required palate surgery to help her breathe properly. With the support of the Pack community, Muddy Paws Rescue was able to cover the cost of every single treatment that Zion needed.

After her recovery and with some generous TLC, Zion revealed her true self—the most loving, polite, smart-as-a-whip, gentle pup her foster had ever known. Once Zion became available for adoption, her foster mom Rachel found that she just couldn't say goodbye!

Since adopting Zion, the two now split their time between Prospect Park in Brooklyn and Lake Cochichuate outside of Boston. Rachel says that adopting Zion was, by far, the best thing to happen to her in 2020. She now enjoys spoiling Zion with all the toys, coats, and gear that an active pup like Zion needs to live her best life!



OPERATING DURING COVID-19

In March of 2020, we found ourselves searching for new ways to operate so that we could continue to save lives while also prioritizing the health and safety of our staff and volunteers.

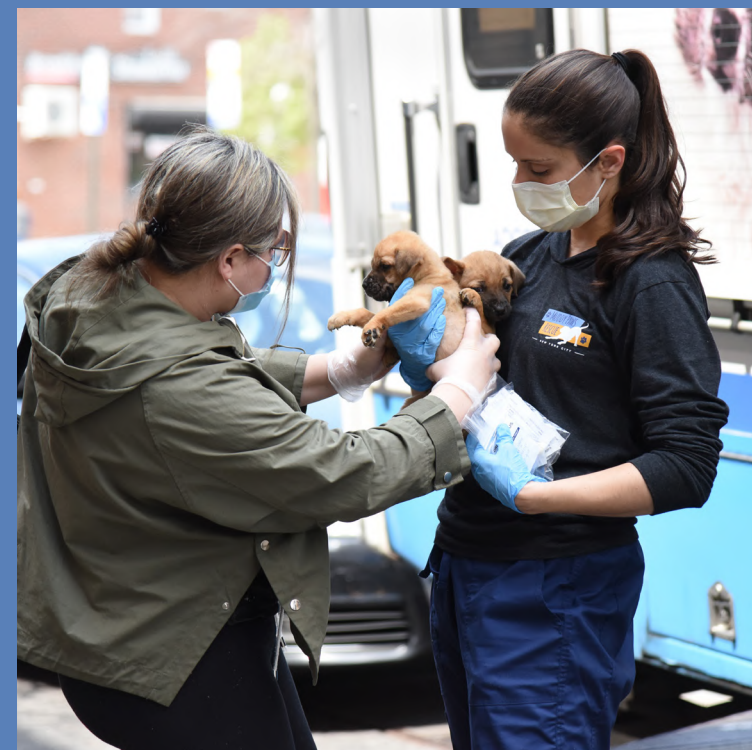


Transport

The statewide PAUSE order that went into effect in March initially brought our interstate transports to a halt. At the same time, the effects of COVID-19 also removed some roadblocks to rescue, allowing otherwise busy New Yorkers to foster and adopt for the first time as they worked from home.

With transports on hold, we increased our intake from local partners so that we could continue to get animals out of the shelter and into foster homes.

Once we were able to safely resume operations, we adjusted our procedures to minimize in-person interaction and built in new sanitization protocols. We also began to utilize our mobile adoption unit to transport animals into the city and across the boroughs to their foster homes.



Adoption Events

We shifted from in-person events to virtual meet & greets and adoption facilitation. With the support of our community, we were able to offer responsible, virtual support during COVID-19 without compromising our commitment to professionalism and high-quality care.



INCREASING SUPPORT FOR AT-RISK POPULATIONS

With an expanded foster network and larger pool of adopters due to COVID-19, we brought added support to our NYC shelter partners by increasing our intake of their most at-risk populations—senior dogs, large dogs, and bully breeds.



We welcomed 63 dogs from the NYC ASPCA and NYC Animal Care Centers, a 186% increase from 2019



We placed 50 senior dogs in foster care, a 4% increase from 2019



Of the dogs transferred from our NYC partners, 78% were large dogs or bully breeds



We welcomed 2 heartworm-positive dogs from NYC shelters into our care





FOSTER PROGRAM GROWTH

In 2020, we grew our foster network to upwards of 2,100 foster homes—a 74% increase from 2019.

With the COVID-19 lockdowns came an increased interest in dog rescue from the general public. Now, more than half of our placements are with first-time fosters. We also enhanced many aspects of the program to offer more virtual support to a growing network of fosters.

New-and-improved foster starter kits: We expanded our network of industry partners to help provide every foster with a starter kit full of enrichment toys, supplies, and high-quality food and treats. We are now better equipped to provide support to every new foster parent, and most importantly, to help our pups adjust to their new environment.

Enhanced mama-and-litter fostering protocols: Our new formalized protocols allows us to provide every four-legged mama with the best medical care within the first few days of arriving into the city. We also offer new enrichment items and specialized training for every mama-and-litter foster.

Online tools and resources for fosters: Our new “Preparing for Your Foster” page went live on our website in 2020 to provide a comprehensive library of tools, virtual trainings, and FAQs. We also launched our foster blog, offering peer-to-peer advice from our very own foster parents. Foster parents can now easily access support topics ranging from tips for fostering with kids, roommates, or resident dogs to dealing with those post-foster blues.

ADOPTIONS GO VIRTUAL

Out of necessity and in response to COVID-19, we shifted from in-person events to facilitating our adoptions virtually on Zoom.

An increased focus on adopter experience

To successfully navigate the changes and challenges of 2020, it became even more critical than usual to maintain a positive, professional experience. We restructured our adoption volunteer role to provide virtual support and expand our matchmaking ability, enhancing the adopter experience from start to finish. According to Maddie's Pet Assistant, 97% of our adopters rated their adoption experience as "good" or "excellent" in 2020 (up from 95% in 2019) and 98% reported having received excellent customer service (up from 94% in 2019).

Adoptions Newsletter

With more adopters waiting to adopt than ever before, we launched a monthly newsletter to keep pre-approved adopters updated on changes to our adoption process as well as to offer tips and resources on what to expect and how to prepare for adopting a dog. The newsletter also supports a newly-formalized organizational priority to provide increased support to our adopters as part of our return/surrender prevention work. In 2020, we reduced our return rate to 7% from 9% in 2019.



7,425 HOURS
VOLUNTEERED

As a community that in “normal” times relies almost entirely on public transit, we needed to dramatically expand our efforts to secure safe and reliable private vehicle transportation for our dogs during COVID-19.

In 2020, our network of volunteer drivers grew from a group of 8 to 24 volunteers who help transport our animals from arrival to their foster homes, to vet appointments and back home to foster care, as well as to adoption meetings. This incredible group also helped us get medications and supplies to our fosters across the city.

Our volunteer drivers provided 195 rides in 2020. **This is 6x the number of rides required in 2019.**

SPONSOR-A-RESCUE

Launched in 2020, our new Sponsor-a-Rescue program offers donors the opportunity to sponsor the transportation of pups from our shelter partners in the south to foster care in NYC. To date, we've celebrated four sponsored rescue operations, which allowed us to welcome 115 pups into the Muddy Paws Pack.



Through the Holiday Wishes Grant Campaign by the Petco Foundation, over 140 of our adopters submitted stories about how their pets have changed their lives, earning Muddy Paws Rescue \$40,000 in grant funding.

In addition to winning an award for the most stories submitted nationally, Zachary Podbela's heartwarming story about his adopted dog, Colt, and Cristy Vo's equally uplifting story about her adopted dog, Beth, were selected as national winners from among thousands of submissions.

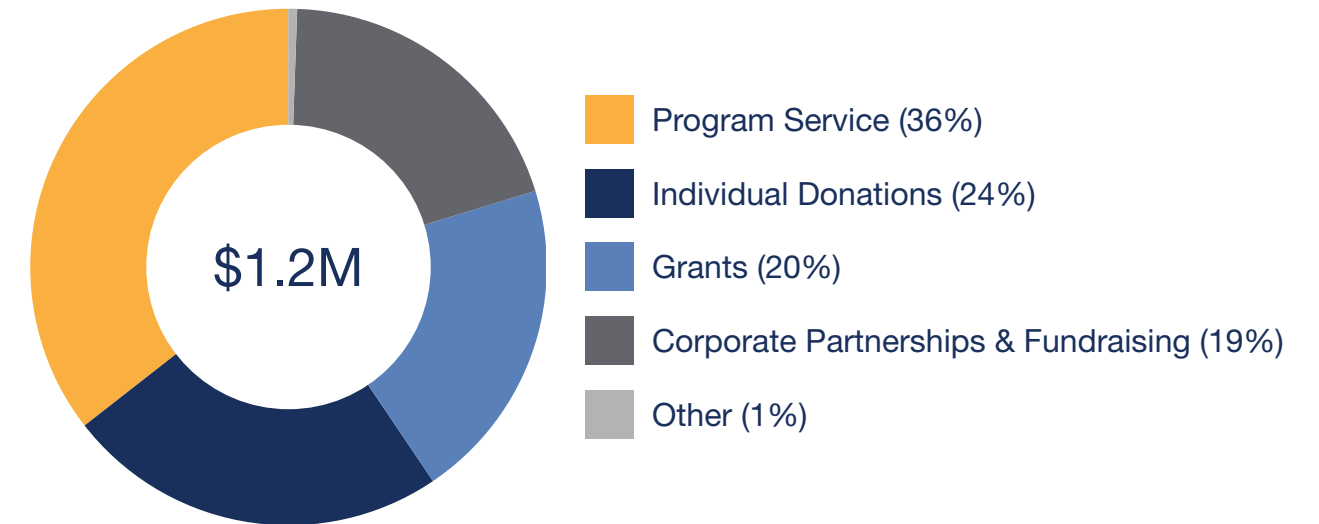
With 76% of our spending allocated to direct animal care and our adoption, foster, and volunteer programs, our donors can feel confident about their investment in our lifesaving mission.



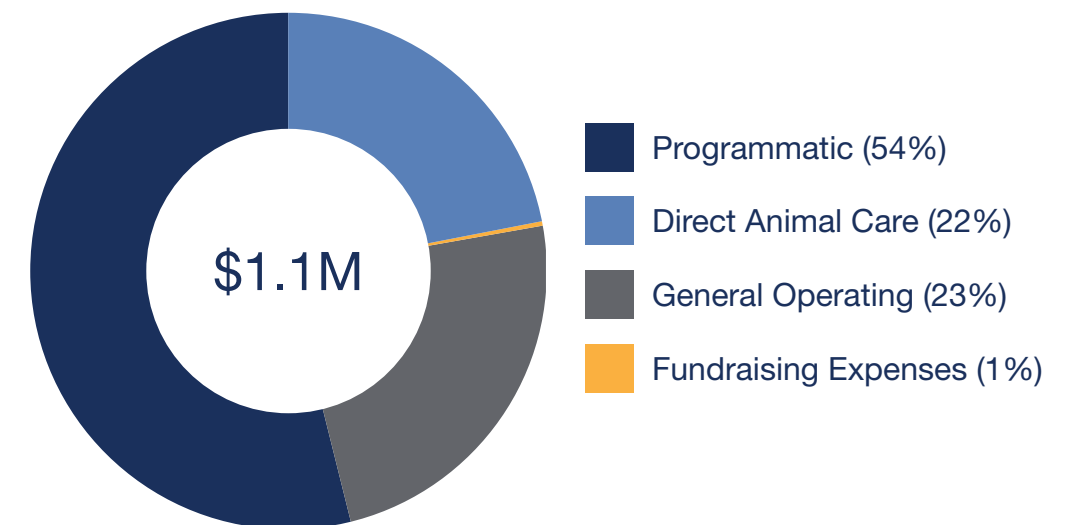
